Guidelines for NEP 2020

B.A. /B.A. (honours) / B.A. (honours with research)

- In NEP 2020, the undergraduate degree B.A. is a 3 year program while the undergraduate degrees B.A honours and B.A honours with research are of 4 years duration. The new policy provides the students with the flexibility to enter, exit and re-enter the program at various stages, each with its corresponding certification as given in the table-1.

*Each Semester is assumed to be of 15 weeks. Besides this, an eight-week summer term has also been included in the academic calendar.

- In the first two semesters, students will study three Discipline Specific Courses (DSE), one Multidisciplinary Course (MDSC), One Value Added Course (VAC), One Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), One Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) and one Compulsory Punjabi or HCP course. Students will choose these subjects from the baskets of subjects offered by the Department (see tables 4, 5, 6 and 7).
- Each subject has been assigned certain number of credits (4, 3 or 2 etc.) as shown in Table-2. One credit would mean either a **teaching/tutorial of 1 hr/week** or a **practical of 2 hrs/week** unless something else is specified in the syllabus of a

particular subject. For example a subject of 4 credits will be taught for 4 hours/week and if a subject of 4 credits is divided into two components say 3 credits for teaching and 1 credit for practical then that subject will be taught for 3 hrs/week and there will be practicals of 2 hrs/week.

- In each semester, students will have to earn 24 credits by qualifying certain number of papers namely DSC (major / minor), MDSC, VAC, SEC, AEC etc. as mentioned in table-2.
- In three years, each student will have to earn 68-72 credits out of total 144 credits by qualifying 17 papers of 4 credits from **a single subject**. This subject will be called his/her **Major Subject**. And students will have to earn 24 credits out of total 144 credits by qualifying 6 papers of 4 credits out of which at least three papers must be from **a single subject different from his/her major subject**. This subject will be called a **minor subject**. The undergraduate degree BA will be awarded in these two subjects.
- From third semester onwards, students will have two DSCs instead of three (as it was in the first two semesters). One of these will be called a **major subject** and other will be called a **minor subject**. One subject will be dropped from the 3rd semester onwards.
- The 8 credits earned during Ist and IInd semester in the subject(s) which is (are) to be dropped at the end of 2nd semester will be counted for the requirement of 24 credits in the minor subject.

➤ No student will be allowed to choose that subject from MDSC basket, which has already been chosen by him/her from the basket(s) of Major or Minor subjects.

➤ **Multiple Entry/Exit option.**

❖ The students are allowed to re-enter the degree program within three years of their exit at any level but they will have to complete the degree within the stipulated **maximum period of seven years.**

- **4-year UG Degree (Honours):** A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 192 credits and have fulfilled the credit requirements as explained above.

- **4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):** Students who secure 75% marks in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students who secure 192 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

- **Infrastructure Requirement:** The Departments offering a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) must have the required infrastructure such as the library, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out experimental research work, and at least two permanent faculty members who are recognized as Ph.D. supervisors. The Departments already recognized for conducting the Ph.D. programme may conduct a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) without obtaining any approval from the affiliating University.

Guidelines Regarding VAC / SEC / MDSC

- Departments offering VAC / SEC / MDSC will have to share following information on the website, so that the students may not have any difficulty in choosing the subjects of different departments/streams.
 1. Name of the VAC / SEC / MDSC.
 2. Timing and venue of VAC / SEC / MDSC.
 3. Total number of seats available in VAC / SEC / MDSC.
- Work load of the faculty members taking VAC / SEC / MDSC will be reflected in the time-table of their respective departments.

❖ The Department of Evening Studies is offering the following VAC / SEC / MDSC. Time schedule has also been given in the enclosed time-table. Students of any department are welcome to attend any of the course(s) offered by the department of Evening Studies.
